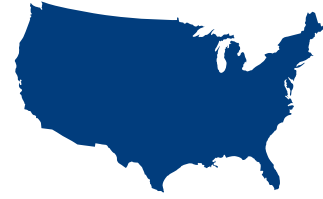


U.S. DAIRY WORKS FOR THE WORLD



Global demand for protein-rich dairy is rising.

Consequently, U.S. dairy exports have more than quadrupled since 2000, to nearly \$5 billion in 2016. Our top five markets are Mexico (\$1.2 billion), Southeast Asia (\$671 million), Canada (\$632 million), China (\$384 million) and South America (\$280 million).

That's good news because dairy exports create nearly 100,000 American jobs, boosting the U.S. economy in New York, California and every state in between.
